Phillip Pental, Member of Parliament, journalist, historian and writer, was the founding president of the City of South Perth Historical Society and author of five books, two of which record the social history of South Perth.

South Perth – The Vanishing Village, 2002; and Hands that Heal: The story of the unique South Perth Hospital, 2006.

Phillip's remarkable contribution to the heritage of South Perth includes the many photographs taken by Phil and his son Simon, creating a lasting photographic record of buildings that no longer exist.

A photograph interwoven with the written word is the inspiration for the Phillip Pental Award "Young Heritage - Written & Photographic."

The City of South Perth Historical Society proudly inaugurated this annual award in 2009 to honour and further Phillip's dream that the Mends Street Village Heritage Precinct become a centre for literature and the arts in the City of South Perth.



CONDITIONS OF ENTRY



1. Open to all students residing in or attending school or college in the City of South Perth.
2. Write a factual historical story of the City of South Perth using as inspiration a photo that portrays the theme. The story cannot be fictional. Theme: My favourite heritage or historical place, building, object or person connected to a suburb of South Perth.
3. Entrants are encouraged to use a clear photograph which they themselves have taken or from their collection. If a photo taken by someone else is used, the source must be acknowledged.
4. The written component must be the original work of entrant and must relate to factual aspects of heritage and history relevant to a suburb of the City of South Perth and boundary rivers.
5. History means anything which happened before today, not necessarily a long time ago.
6. The length of the entry should be between 100 and 800 words, having regard to the age of the entrant.
7. Entries must include a bibliography stating the sources from which information in the entry was obtained.
8. Only one entry per student. Joint entries are not permitted.
9. The entry is to be on A4 or A3 size paper and must not exceed that size.
10. Only one photo, which must be either portrait or landscape. Colour or black and white. Photo paper is preferred. The photo may be a photocopy on A4 or A3 paper.
11. The written entry, photo and attached entry form must be lodged on Friday, 20 May at Heritage House, 111 Mill Point Road, (corner Mends Street), South Perth between 10 am and 5 pm. Alternatively, digital entries will be accepted at the email address info@southperthhistoricalsociety.org, the written entry to be in MS Word 2000 or higher and the photo to be in 300 dpi or more.
12. The written entries and selected entries of Special Merit will be mounted, framed and displayed at Heritage House for a limited time. The selection and mode of display will be at the discretion of the curator. All entries will be retained by the City of South Perth Historical Society and may be used in future promotion of the Award or future heritage displays or publications of the Society. The entrant's name will be acknowledged in all publications of the entry.
13. The judges' decision is final. No correspondence will be entered into.

All reasonable care will be taken to protect entries but liability for damage or loss of any entry will not be accepted.
